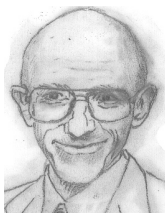

Turning the tide?

After the presentation of arguments on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday before the U.S. Supreme Court, the chances for survival of the new Health Care Act passed by Congress in 2010 seemed mighty slim. Most Republicanrats have opposed the legislation all along.



The essential hang-up is the law's mandate that all Americans pay for—or in some other way for those unable to pay, sign up for—health insurance. This mandate is likely to be deemed unconstitutional by at least five justices who were appointed to the Court by Republicanrat Presidents.

So, one might erroneously conclude that the Court's anti-mandate bias is political, but not so. The scheme to mandate total sign-up for health coverage was put forward many years ago by the very conservative Heritage Foundation. At that time, the Foundation suggested that the mandate would eliminate the problem of uninsured citizens getting a "free ride" on the healthcare system that everyone else or their employers were paying for. But those who are most blindly opposed to the mandate are unaware of this. Besides, they choose to believe that President Obama or some liberal thought it up.

Big lies home to roost...

This blindness of Americans to history leaves the nation at the mercy of those Special Interests which are in a position to most thoroughly sell their Big Lies. In today's climate of corporation worship, the big lies are most effectively sold by those persons or organizations with the deepest pockets and the most to gain. Here are just a few of these Big Lies that have sold well:

[Lie 1] regulation of business is destroying American free enterprise;

[Lie 2] big government is destroying the American dream and the American way of life;

The Super Lie...

The Super Lie underpinning the most vehement grass-roots right

wing of the right wing of the GOP since President Barack Obama was sworn into office on January 20, 2009, is the conviction that Obama is a threat to America's cherished values and, parenthetically, that he is a foreigner with a foreign religion and foreign allegiance. The driving force behind this Super Lie is the freely-spent wealth of several ultra-conservative fatcats in a very successful nationwide effort to feed on the frustrations, ignorance, and white-supremacy heritage of millions of mostly-ignorant, mostly-white, middle-class Americans.

Why is this possible and why is it happening now?

We are now harvesting the fruits of the well-financed Big Lies of the past 30 years. This propaganda has primed most of us to accept a scenario for America's rise to power and hegemony which has been used to manipulate the citizens of just about every world power since the beginning of recorded history. It goes something like this:

—The people are not only free but also possess heroic characteristics.

—In its pure form, their system of government facilitates its citizens' pursuit of greatness, naturally producing immensely wealthy, powerful leading citizens.

—And all the people are the beneficiaries of the earth's bounty because they are faithful to the right god(s).

Short form: "We are great (rich, powerful and safe) because we think right, so we deserve to be ever greater. Only those who disagree can bring us down."

What if the new health law is trashed by the Court?

Is it the end of the world if the new health act is ruled unconstitutional by five of the Justices? Of course not. It will either be fixed or replaced with something that the Justices can approve. If most Americans vote Conservative in November, health care will probably be left to the private sector. Only a very strong Progressive victory could seat a new Congress unified enough in both houses to make the legislation Court-proof.

What if most voters actually detest the safety net?

If a majority of U.S. voters really are fed up with the Democrats and hunger for small government, the Republicanrats will win solid majority control of both houses of Congress in November. Such a Congress could assume that the voters want to get Big Government off their backs and out of their pockets.

If this comes about, the conservatives could begin rolling back all of the Big Government programs which are eating up federal revenues. Deeper tax cuts for the affluent would then be possible, too.

The Republicanrats could move ahead with measures to free the people from the so-called creeping liberalism of a century. Some measures they would be free to legislate might include:

• Repair Social Security by (1) raising the retirement age to 68 or 70 and (2) freeze future SS payments by eliminating the Cost-of-Living indexing.

• Fix the collapse of Medicare by (1) putting a fixed lifetime cap of \$500,000 on the total payout for each enrollee and (2) phase out the prescription benefit (it was passed by the Republicanrats in 2004 but was never funded).

• Phase out Medicaid over 10 years, primarily by gradually eliminating the matching grants to each state.

• Control mushrooming Federal health insurance for military retirees (except combat-related military benefits) by gradually, over 10 years, raising the time-in-service requirement to 35 years, plus capping lifetime benefit payouts.

• Control health insurance costs for other Federal employees by raising the employee contribution about 5 percent a year for 10 years.

• Also, freeze Federal retirement payments by eliminating Cost-of-Living increases.

• Cut Agriculture Department, Housing and Urban Development, Food and Drug Administration, Health and Human Services, and Department of Education costs by mandating reduction of each department's budget by 5 percent a year for 10 years.

• Let all drug manufacturers and food processors regulate themselves.

• Increase Defense Department and Homeland Security (FBI, CIA, etc.) budgets by 5 percent a year for 10 years.

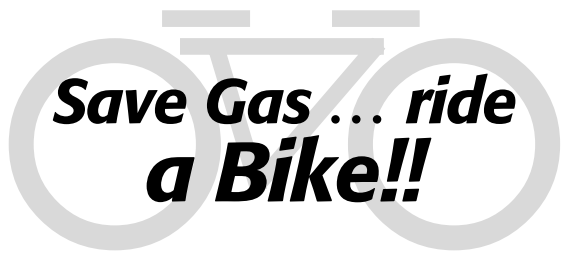
